

General Information

To access an Eduroam Wireless Network, you must first be at an EduRoam enable Institution and not on a CSU campus. The instructions below will guide you through the Configuration and access steps to connecting to an EduRoam Wireless Network.

Note: that Some EduRoam institutions only allow VPN access back to CSU whilst others also allow Internet traffic.

Requirements

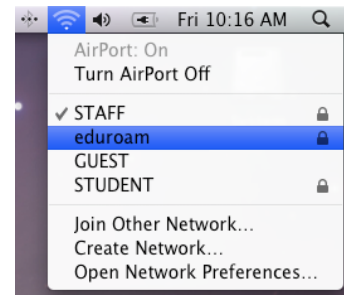
Your laptop must meet the following requirements:

- MacOS X Version 10.4 or Higher, with a Wireless Airport card
- Administration rights on your computer

Section 1 - Connecting to an EduRoam Wireless Network

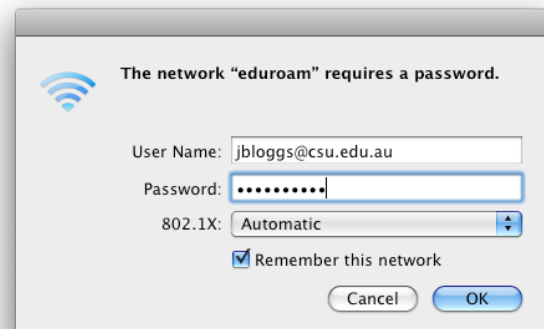
Step 1

Click on the Apple Airport icon near the top right of your screen to display the wireless networks menu. Select the "EDUROAM" network from the list.



Step 2

You will be asked to log into the wireless network. Your eduroam username is in the format of "username@csu.edu.au" – eg: jbloggs@csu.edu.au. Place your EduRoam username into the "User Name" field, and your CSU password into the "Password" field. Click the "OK" button.



Step 3

You may be presented with a "Verify Certificate" window similar to the window to the right. If so, click on the "Show Certificate" button and then place a tick next to "Always trust these certificates". Click the "Continue" button.

If you are asked for your password, enter your computer's password (if any) and click the "OK" button



Congratulations, you have connected to the eduroam wireless network.
