What is CSU's Bachelor of Arts (Television Production)?

This unique and strongly focused course prepares you for entry to the broadcast television, pay television, independent production and related industries.

You will gain the necessary vocational, creative and theoretical skills to pursue high-powered careers in the broadcast and entertainment industries.

Assessment tasks are designed to expose you to similar challenges and experiences to those found in industry, while intensive hands-on experience ensures graduates are industry-ready.

Practical experience is offered from the very start of the course, and you will continually produce television material for assessments, regular screening events and online broadcasts.

What will I learn?

This course provides study and training in all facets of the creative process, including scriptwriting, single and multi-camera production, multi-track sound recording, linear and non-linear post-production and multi-camera outside broadcast production.

An elective strand allows you to undertake complementary study in fields including Animation and Visual Effects, Design for Theatre and Television, Graphic Design, Photography and communications disciplines.

Facilities

You will enjoy an enviable range of first-rate industry-standard facilities on campus, including:

- a broadcast standard multi-camera television studio
- a six-camera high-definition outside broadcast truck
- a suite of 12 post-production rooms
- three audio suites
- a range of broadcast quality outside cameras and field equipment.

Professionals teaching you

This course is staffed and taught by industry-trained professionals and includes regular visits from current network employees. It is recognised as a key supplier of high standard television personnel.

- you will gain experience using industry-standard equipment from the very start of the course
- this course is recognised by the television industry for producing graduates of a high standard
- diverse career options are available in regional and metropolitan areas working for free-to-air, pay, satellite and corporate television networks.





Career opportunities

Graduates of this course work for regional and metropolitan free-to-air, pay, satellite and corporate television networks.

Possible careers include:

- television production, production management and direction
- studio, outside broadcast and location camera operation
- studio and location sound control, recording and post-production
- single and multi-camera television studio production and technical operations roles
- outside broadcast production and technical operation
- linear and non-linear editing.

Workplace learning

The Bachelor of Arts (Television Production) is actively supported by the broadcast and pay television industries through the third-year internship program.

You will also gain extensive practical experience creating work for assessments, online broadcast and screening events, and developing skills using CSU's industry-standard facilities.

How to apply

Year 12 students apply through UAC and are selected on the basis of their ATAR and an interview and/or portfolio.

It is recommended prospective students attend an interview in Wagga Wagga in late November or early December. The informal interview is designed to ensure prospective students have the opportunity to gain first-hand information about the course, and for CSU to see whether the course is suitable for you.

An interview form must be returned to the School of Communication and Creative Industries at Wagga Wagga Campus at least a week before the interview date.
