### Enabling Occupation: Vision, Principles, and Strategies in Everyday Practice

In this half day workshop, participants will use a generic practice case to generate insights on enabling occupation with clients (including individuals, communities, or organizations) and on managing occupation-based enablement in health and other service sectors. In this highly interactive event, we will profile strategic use of four of the profession's newest models: the Canadian Model of Occupational Performance and Engagement (CMOP-E), the Canadian Model of Client-Centred Enablement (CMCE), the Canadian Practice Process Framework (CPPF), and the Participatory Occupational Justice Framework (POJF).

### Elizabeth Townsend, Ph.D., O.T. (C), Reg.N.S., FCAOT

Liz is Professor and Director of the School of Occupational Therapy at Dalhousie University in Nova Scotia, Canada. She holds Cross-Appointments with the School of Nursing and the Faculty of Medicine's Department of Community Health and Epidemiology. Her research and teaching focus on critical analyses of community practice, client-centred practice, enabling empowerment, and enabling occupational justice as theory and practice. She has participated in producing all eight Canadian guidelines for occupational therapy's client-centred, occupation-based practice and is the first author of *Enabling Occupation II: Advancing an Occupational Therapy Vision of Health, Well-Being, and Justice through Occupation* (2007), published by the Canadian Association of

Occupational Therapists. In addition to guidelines books, she has authored 3 books and 15 chapters, plus over 80 peer reviewed publications and over 250 invited presentations.
