Division 1 Introduction

1 Name of Rule

This Rule is the *Governance (Pro Chancellor) Rule 2007*.

2 Commencement

This Rule commences on 31 August 2007 [CNL07/100]

3 Purpose

This Rule is enacted for the purpose of establishing the ceremonial position of Pro Chancellor and defining the functions of the position.

4 Authority

This Rule is made pursuant to authority granted to the Council under section 31 (1) and 32 of the Act.

Notes

Section 31 (1) and 32 of the Act states that the Council may make Rules.

5 Definitions

(1) In this Rule:

Act means the *Charles Sturt University Act 1989*.

By-law means the *Charles Sturt University By-law 2005*.

Secretary means the Secretary appointed under clause 19 of the By-law and includes a person or persons appointed to act on behalf of the Secretary from time to time.

6 Notes and Headings

(1) The notes in the text of this Rule do not form part of this Rule.

(2) Headings do not form part of this Rule.

Division 2 Members and officeholders of committees

7 Establishment of office of Pro Chancellor

There is a ceremonial position of Pro Chancellor.

8 Appointment of Pro Chancellor

(1) The Council may, by resolution, appoint a maximum of 2 persons to the position of Pro Chancellor for such a term, not exceeding 2 years, as may be determined by the Council from time to time.

- (2) Despite sub-clause (1), an appointment may be terminated at any time by notice in writing signed by the Chancellor.

9 Status and Function of Pro Chancellor

- (1) The Pro Chancellor is an honorary position of the Council.
- (2) The Pro Chancellor may, at the formal invitation of the Chancellor, preside at official ceremonies of the University within Australia on behalf of the Chancellor where the Chancellor and Deputy Chancellor are unable to do so.

10 Form of dress

The form of ceremonial dress of the Pro Chancellor will be as determined by the Secretary from time to time.

11 Limitations

- (1) The office of the Pro Chancellor is a ceremonial office and holds no formal authority on behalf of the University.
- (2) The Pro Chancellor may not bind or make representations for or on behalf of the University.

Division 3 Expenses

12 Expenses generally

- (1) Clauses 11, 12, 13, 17, 18 and 19 of the *Governance (Council Allowance) Rule 2006* apply to the Pro Chancellor as though the Pro Chancellor were an eligible member under that Rule.
- (2) No other provisions of the *Governance (Council Allowance) Rule 2006* apply to the position of the Pro Chancellor.
