



HOW DO I APPLY?

1. Complete and sign the International Application for Admission form and in the Course Details section, write 'Study Abroad' in the Name of Course section.
 - www.csu.edu.au/division/intemat/downloads/onshore_application.pdf
2. Attach the following documents:
 - certified* copies, together with English translations, of your secondary school results and any post secondary study you have undertaken
 - evidence of your English language proficiency results (for example IELTS or TOEFL)
 - any other official certificates, such as short courses which can support your application for admission

* Persons eligible to certify copies are: an authorised officer from the institution that originally issued the documents, an Australian Overseas Diplomatic Mission or Australian Education Office, Charles Sturt University representative, Public Notary, Justice of the Peace or staff member of Charles Sturt University. The authorised officer must sign and print their name clearly, include the date and an official stamp or seal of the authorised officer's organisation.

3. Send the Application for Admission form and supporting documentation to either CSU or the Study Abroad office at your institution, or through an agent. Remember that you will need to get approval from your home institution if you want to receive credit in any course you are currently studying.

4. If you meet the entry requirements, you will receive a formal Offer of Admission (conditional or unconditional), providing information on the course of offer, starting date and payment of fees. An information package for international students containing an Acceptance of Offer form, a copy of the University's Refund Policy and information on accommodation and living at CSU is also included with your offer letter.

Information on accepting your Offer of Admission and applying for your student visa will be provided with your Offer of Admission.

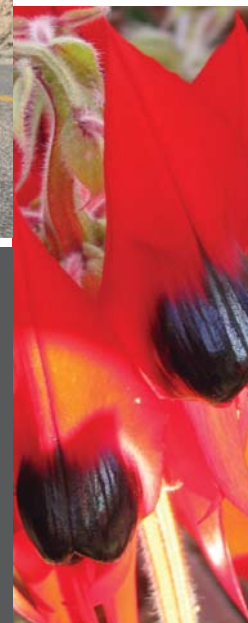

YOUR STUDY PLAN

GUIDELINES FOR SUBJECT SELECTION

As a Study Abroad student at CSU, you have the flexibility to choose to study single subjects from a variety of disciplines. You may need to provide evidence of meeting prerequisites for some subjects. The normal full-time program load at CSU is four subjects per session, usually made up of four 8 point subjects, with two study sessions in each year. However, by choosing Study Abroad at CSU you can study just three subjects, provided at least one is studied in the face-to-face mode and the others in the distance education mode*.

1. Choose a course of interest from the courses list www.csu.edu.au/courses/ and then select your subjects of your choice from within these courses. You are not restricted to one course only. The subject descriptions can be found within the course structure and are linked to the online handbook. www.csu.edu.au/handbook

2. Check that the subjects you select are offered in the semester you plan to study at CSU and are available at one CSU campus only. When selecting subjects please remember the following: Sessions 1, 3 and 5 start in late February (Autumn session) and Sessions 2, 4, and 6 start in late July (Spring session)

3. Check that your choices are appropriate and your prior studies meet our prerequisites

4. If you are studying at an institution in your home country, talk to your adviser and gain pre-approval for your subject choices to gain credit in your studies

5. Complete your choice of subjects on your application form. Make sure that you select additional subjects and list in order of preference to allow for flexibility. This will also cover you if you have timetable clashes

6. You need to select your subjects and receive a written offer and confirmation of the subjects from CSU before arriving in Australia. CSU can assist you with selecting units that meet your interests and needs.

* distance education mode is where instead of attending lectures, students receive printed course materials and maintain contact with lecturers via the University's comprehensive online communication system.

* face-to-face means you attend regular classes on campus which may include lectures, tutorials or laboratory/practical classes

CREDIT TRANSFER

If you intend to earn credit towards your degree, your home institution must approve the subjects before you come to Australia. You will also need to satisfy CSU prerequisites for the subjects you choose by providing evidence of studies that you have taken in relevant discipline areas. You can find details on prerequisites for each subject by looking at the subject description in the handbook. www.csu.edu.au/handbook

Once you have completed your studies at CSU, we will send a transcript to your home institution for credit transfer processing.

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Course: a program of study leading to an award.
Lecture: a period of teaching given by a lecturer to a large group of students.

Prerequisite: a subject or level of study which must be successfully completed before another subject can be studied.

Session/Semester: a teaching period including 13 teaching weeks followed by examinations. Within each session, there is a mid-semester break of about two weeks.

Subject: a unit of study in a degree.
Tutorial: a period of teaching given to a small group of students, involving discussion and participation.

FAQ: What are the admission requirements for Study Abroad at CSU?

Students are required to meet both the academic and English language proficiency entry requirements. For admission to Study Abroad prospective students need to indicate their likelihood of success through previous studies and other attainments and experience. Previous studies could include completion of an overseas equivalent of an Australian Year 12 qualification OR completion or part completion of post secondary study.
