

Test Drive your Assessment

Once you've created an assessment, you can Test Drive it to see what the student experience will be.



In the links at the top of the window, click on **Test Drive**.

The page looks just as it will to students. The tests are ready to begin, so click on **Ready to begin** in the Status column, or on **Begin** under the test title to get started.

The test will open up for you to take. It will be *exactly* the same experience that your students will have.


If you have published an assessment and its open date has not arrived, you (and students) will see Not Yet Open.

If you allow multiple tries, you will see the number allowed, like the students will, though you have the power to test-drive more times.

If you set a time limit for an assessment, you will get the same limit when you test drive it.

If you've set the exam for review feedback after submission, you will be able to review how you did right after you click the Finish button.

After reviewing (if allowed) your results, you will be returned to the Test Drive list of assessments. You'll see how many points you earned and there is a link to go back into Review if you want.

Differences Between Test Drive and an Actual Student Experience:

- Unlike students, instructors can test drive **UNpublished** assessments. Students don't see unpublished assessments in their Test Center. This functionality allows you to test-drive your assessments *before* you publish them to catch errors before they are published and 'frozen'.
- You will be able to test drive an assessment as many times as you wish, regardless of how many tries you've allowed students.
- You will see your score in review, as per settings, but no instructor submissions are logged in Grading and instructor scores are not sent to the Gradebook.
- When settings are changed for an assessment, the earlier attempts of the instructor are cleared so that you can test drive it again.
