### → Not sure where to find resources for your study?

**Subject Support** provides a step-by-step guide to finding resources for your assignments. It includes short tutorials on analysing your topic, and searching for books, journal articles and websites. Subject Support also provides links to resources on referencing, avoiding plagiarism, useful statistics and the latest subject news.

### → Read entire books and find thousands of journals – online!

CSU students have **free access** to thousands of online books on a wide range of topics, and CSU Library has **over 40,000 online journals** that you can use for free to research your subject.

### → Search the Library catalogue anytime, day or night.

Use the **Library Catalogue** to find resources such as ebooks (electronic books), online journals, great internet resources and hundreds of online reserve items.

### → Enrolled in Indigenous Studies? We can help!

To help you complete your Indigenous Studies assignments, follow these four easy steps:

1. Create your search strategy using **Indigenous Studies Dictionaries & Encyclopaedias** to define your topic: [csu.edu.au/division/library/find-info/subject/indigenous/dictionaries.html](http://csu.edu.au/division/library/find-info/subject/indigenous/dictionaries.html)
2. Search the **Library Catalogue** for books and other resources.
3. Search the Journal Databases to search for articles from journals, magazines and newspapers; see the **Indigenous Studies Databases** for a list of databases that relate to your subject: [csu.edu.au/division/library/find-info/databases/subject/indigenous.html](http://csu.edu.au/division/library/find-info/databases/subject/indigenous.html)
4. Explore useful websites; you can find a lot of current information about Indigenous Studies on the internet – visit **Indigenous Studies Useful Websites** for a list of useful web resources that relate to your subject: [csu.edu.au/division/library/find-info/subject/indigenous/websites.html](http://csu.edu.au/division/library/find-info/subject/indigenous/websites.html)

## → Find extra readings for your course.

CSU Library's **eReserve** collection contains online readings that support some course subjects. Search the Library Catalogue by your subject code (e.g., BUS101) to find relevant readings.

## → Information at your fingertips.

Use **Online Reference** to find links to statistics, encyclopaedias, industry regulations, dictionaries, atlases, images, telephone directories and much more.

## → Borrow up to 20 items at a time!

Did you know that you can borrow up to 20 items (books, videos or AV items)? The only thing you need is a current **CSU ID card**.

## → Use My Library Record to manage your loans.

You can view and renew current loans and check the status of your holds and copy requests by logging onto **My Library Record**.

## → Get assistance, whenever and wherever you need it.

The Library team are here to help! Here are some ways to contact us:

- Talk to one of the Library team in real-time with **Live Chat** or leave a message and we'll contact you. Live Chat is available from **10am to 4pm, Monday to Friday**.
- Use the **Ask a Question web form** to ask a Librarian for help with your study. Check out the databases of previously answered questions – visit [csu.edu.au/division/library/help/web-form.html](http://csu.edu.au/division/library/help/web-form.html).
- Talk to other CSU students and the Library team on the **online forum** – your chance to tell the Library team what you think of Library services and resources.
- Check out the **Watch-It! Tutorials**, short videos that help you with your study.
- Develop your research skills with **InfoSkills@CSU** self-paced tutorials.
- Contact your **Library Liaison** – you can find the liaison for your campus in the list at right.
