THE BACHELOR OF SOCIAL SCIENCE (EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT)

Charles Sturt University's Bachelor of Social Science (Emergency Management) course aims to develop a theoretical as well as practical base for people who have responsibilities in the field of emergency risk management. Its primary focus is on the principles and practices of comprehensive emergency risk management, including emergency risk management planning, operations management and recovery management.

The course focuses on meeting the needs of a variety of client groups, from public bodies such as local government, emergency and community services, to private industry, including essential services, public utilities, manufacturing industries and the commercial sector.

The Bachelor degree offers:

- The advantages of distance education – flexibility in study times means that you can remain in employment and you can study from your home country
- Learning materials and assessments that are relevant, up-to-date and that meet the standards required by the emergency management industry
- Easy access to qualified and experienced staff through a variety of means including telephone, facsimile, email and online discussion forums

WHO IS ELIGIBLE TO ENROL?

To qualify for admission into the Bachelor of Social Science (Emergency Management), applicants must have responsibilities for managing or operations in an emergency management environment.

IS CREDIT AVAILABLE FOR THE COURSE?

Yes, credit is available for students who have:

- Completed at least three years employment in an industry or position related to emergency management prior to application (6 subject credit)
- Evidence of successful study at tertiary level for two subjects and evidence of ongoing professional development or evidence of at least two years active membership of an appropriate professional association (2 subject credit)
