Accelerated Enrolment Patterns

The following enrolment patterns are designed to facilitate the completion of this course over a period of two calendar years, and are based on the following assumptions:

- that students will complete all six core Level 3 PSY subjects. Students who choose not to complete the sixth core Level 3 PSY subject will need to modify the enrolment pattern to include an additional elective;
- that only students admitted in Session 1 each year will be supported to complete their degree across two calendar years;
- that students who fail to complete <u>PSY101</u>, <u>PSY102</u>, or <u>PSY201</u>on the first attempt will not be able to continue with this accelerated enrolment pattern;

• that some distance education study may be required where the subject offerings do not support a full-time on-campus study load;

- that Session 3 PSY subjects will be offered only in the distance education mode;
- that the School of Psychology cannot guarantee that every minor sequence available will be able to be completed within two calendar years.

Students completing a minor sequence with subject offerings in Sessions 1 and 2 only will need to defer their study of <u>SOC102</u>until Session 3; they will need to complete all their electives in Session 3.

Students will be responsible for planning their enrolment to satisfy course requirements within the two year timeframe, so careful advance planning across the entire course duration will be required. Students who choose to complete six sessions of full-time study within two calendar years will not be able to base any claim of special consideration on their chosen study pattern e.g., as it may relate to academic performance and course transfer to the BPsych or BPsych(Hons), or admission to the PGDipPsych or BSocSc(Psych)(Hons).
