Admission to the program is contingent upon:

- successful completion of Certificate III in Wiradjuri Language or equivalent, and a personal statement documenting relevant professional or community expertise and/or experience. Examples of relevant professional or community expertise and/or experience could include: professional engagement with members of the Wiradjuri people in either

paid employment or in a voluntary capacity; teaching Wiradjuri language in TAFE, VET private providers or schools; people working with, or in, the Wiradjuri community in social, support or other capacities. Proficiency Credit for Indigenous Knowledges will be assessed at the point of entry

or

- students who have completed, or are completing, a university degree and who have completed a Certificate III in Wiradjuri Language, or equivalent.

Direct entry application and relevant levels of experience and expertise will be the responsibility of, and be determined by, the Course Coordinator.
