Master of Emergency Management

Applicants who wish to be considered for admission to the course will have to satisfy all of the following criteria, which will be considered the equivalent of a four-year degree:

- the successful completion of a three-year degree in emergency management, risk management or an allied discipline area;
- at least five years experience in an industry related to this field of study;
- evidence of continuing professional education and development;
- evidence of emergency management role and responsibilities within their industry, organisation or community.

Articulation

The Master, Graduate Diploma *[Exit Point Only]* and Graduate Certificate *[Exit Point Only]* make up an articulated set of courses and credit is given in each higher level course for the subjects completed in the lower.

To graduate students must satisfactorily complete 96 points.

Graduate Diploma of Emergency Management *[Exit Point Only]*

To graduate students must satisfactorily complete 64 points.

Graduate Certificate in Emergency Management *[Exit Point Only]*

To graduate students must satisfactorily complete 32 points.
