Normal course duration

Master of Theology (Research)

Full-time 1.0 years (2.0 sessions)

Full-time: minimum one year, maximum two years

Part-time: minimum two years, maximum four years

Applicants should hold:

- a Master of Theology from Charles Sturt University with a Distinction average plus evidence of research; or
- a Bachelor of Theology (Honours) with Class 1 or Class 2 Division 1 from Charles Sturt University; or
- an award from another accredited tertiary institution, accepted by the University as equivalent to one of the above awards, and/or have demonstrated in study or professional performance potential to undertake research at a Master degree level.

Intending applicants should contact the Sub-Dean, Graduate Studies in the Faculty of Arts and Education to discuss the proposal before applying for admission to the program. In addition, applicants must complete a form describing their area of interest, which should accompany their application.

Admission to candidature is subject to approval by the Research Advisory Committee.
