Of these, 32 points are allocated to core studies, 72 points will be allocated a discipline specialisation (note that under CSU policy students can not be awarded an Associate Degree with a specialisation noted), and 24 points allocated to an elective study strand of the student's choice from offerings within the School of Communication & Creative Industries (or externally by approval of the Course Director).
