1. either hold a Bachelor degree in a related area, or have qualified for an equivalent award; or
2. have completed the requirements of the Graduate Diploma in Leadership and Management (Policing and Security) or subjects deemed equivalent by the Course Coordinator.

Candidates for admission to the Executive Masters in International Police Leadership shall:

1. Hold a Bachelor degree in a related area, or have qualified for an equivalent award, or
2. Have completed the requirements of the Canadian Police College Executive Development Program

Additionally, a number of police jurisdictions have credit arrangements with awards in AGSPS , and prospective applicants should discuss these with the Course Coordinator.
